From scholarships to batting cages, our community steps up for CC students

A number of local and regional organizations have shown their support for the Centralia College Foundation and the Trailblazers we support. These life-changing donations and grants are helping Centralia College students complete their degrees and transform their lives. Here are a few of the major donations and grants the Foundation has received this fall.

New scholarship announced for criminal justice students

In a final act of service to its community, the Lewis County Sheriff's Office Reserve Association donated its remaining funds -\$5,250 – to the Foundation for a new scholarship. The Lewis County Sheriff's Office Reserve Association Scholarship is for \$1,000 per year and will be awarded to a secondyear Centralia College student studying criminal justice. The scholarship will be awarded in the spring and annually through the Foundation's normal scholarship awarding process.



PSE Supports Trailblazer Food Pantry

This fall, the Centralia College Foundation received a \$2,250 check from Puget Sound Energy to benefit the Blazer Food Pantry, the on-campus food pantry for current Centralia College students. PSE has donated for the last several years, allowing the pantry to buy students the food and supplies they most need.



Donation to benefit Diesel Technology students at Centralia College

In September, the Foundation received a \$5,000 donation from the Dennis and Phyllis Washington Foundation to fund scholarships for Centralia College students earning their bachelor's degrees in Diesel Technology. Dennis and Phyllis Washington purchased Modern Machinery, a heavy equipment dealer, which now has 10 locations in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana. Delivering the check to the CC Foundation was Jeff Bell, the branch manager at the Grand Mound location. Centralia College has the only bachelor's degree program in Diesel Technology in the Pacific Northwest.



Scholarships helps local students become healthcare professionals

Coordinated Care, a Washington State provider of low-cost and free health insurance, has committed \$25,000 to the Foundation to provide scholarships and emergency grants to CC students in healthcare programs. Half of the funds will be awarded in the spring through the Foundation's normal scholarship process. The other half of the funds will be awarded to students facing one-time financial hardships that threaten their ability to continue their education. These funds will be awarded through the college's existing emergency grant process.



Grant supports construction of batting cages at Bob Peters Field

The Foundation was awarded a \$35,000 grant from the Ben B. **Cheney Foundation to support** the construction of batting cages at Bob Peters Field at Centralia College. The Foundation applied for the grant over the summer and was notified of its award in October. Construction of the batting cages is expected to be completed in time for the start of baseball and softball team practices in February. Fundraising for the field is ongoing, as additional funds are needed for the bleachers, press booth, and other amenities. Corrections program builds a national reputation

CC's Corrections Education program presented at several major conferences this year. They presented at the Corrections Education Association (CEA) national conference in New Orleans in April, and at the CEA international conference in Portland in August. They also presented at the Washington State Corrections Education Conference in Spokane in May. Faculty members Rick Cowan and Bruce Carley presented on the Construction Trades Apprenticeship Preparation program and apprenticeships at all three conferences, and then-faculty member Liselotte Thompson (now dean of transitional studies) and Corrections Dean Lyz Grant presented at the CEA conference in Portland. The team received very positive feedback from participants.

Diesel celebrates new partnerships

The Diesel Tech program recently joined with Papé Kenworth (dealer) and Kenworth (manufacturer) to become a dealer partner school. Papé Kenworth donated a sixweek rental of a 2023 Kenworth T880 for the Bachelor of Applied Science — Diesel Technology (BAS-DT) emissions class. Kenworth donated a data link and the Kenworth diagnostic service software. The BAS-DT program is also utilizing the Kenworth Essentials online training modules.

(The CDL program previously borrowed trucks from the diesel program.) The new trucks and the lease are funded by a grant from the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges. A third truck will be coming soon. Also at the event, the CDL program recognized Rayonier Forest Products for its support. A donation to the CC Foundation from Rayonier was used to fund GPS systems in the new trucks.



Centralia College Athletic Director Bob Peters retires

Bob Peters, Centralia College's longest-serving athletic director and the namesake for the new Bob Peters Field, retired Oct. 31. A retirement celebration will be held at a later date. Those details will be announced when they are finalized. In the meantime, Bob will continue his involvement with Centralia College and the Centralia College Foundation, and promises he will forever bleed blue and gold.

"Bob has been such an amazing leader at the college for so many years and will be greatly missed," said Robert Cox, vice president of Student Services. "There's no way to express our appreciation for all of the great things Bob has done. His mentorship and role modeling for thousands of student athletes has had a profound impact on their lives."

Bob grew up on Silver Street a block from the college and spent his childhood days sneaking into the gym and playing on Noble Field. He graduated from Centralia High School in 1979 and came to Centralia College that year to play basketball and start working on his Associate of Arts degree. After graduating from CC in 1981, he transferred to Western Washington University, where he played basketball and completed his degree in education. He wanted to teach PE and health and coach basketball, but wasn't sure where. He came back to Centralia and started looking for work.

After substitute teaching at local area schools for a few years, an opportunity came at Centralia College, when his former coach and CC Athletic Director Bob Reimer offered him a position. He



started at CC in the fall of 1986 as a part-time assistant men's basketball coach. He also taught health and PE part-time.

Bob served as the men's basketball assistant coach from 1986-90 and even pulled double duty for a few years, coaching both the men's and women's teams at the same time. He was the head women's basketball coach from 1988-91. He married his wife Shawn in 1988. Shawn has taught Kindergarten and Special Education and is currently working as an Instructional Facilitator for the Centralia School District. In 1991, Bob took over as the head coach of men's basketball and was named CC Athletic Director. He also continued to teach health and PE classes. CC only offered four sports then. Today, there are eight. On May 22, the new Centralia College athletics complex was officially dedicated as Bob Peters Field in honor of Bob's contributions to CC athletics.

Bob and Shawn have three children, Hillary Hull, Bailey Moon, and Christian Peters, and three grandchildren.

"It was the family environment that kept me here for so many years," Bob said. "I love working with kids and seeing them succeed. We provide a good experience for them and help them get on the right track. Plus, all my family is here. I always wanted to be close to my family."

Men's basketball coach Joe Chirhart has been serving as the interim athletics director since Oct. 16.





Chris Thomas appointed to Centralia College Board of Trustees

Gov. Jay Inslee has appointed Chris Thomas to serve on the Centralia College Board of Trustees. Thomas was introduced at the Oct. 16 meeting. Trustees are appointed by the governor for fiveyear terms for a maximum of 10 years.

Thomas replaces Doris Wood-Brumsickle, who ended a 10-year stint on the board in September.

"Doris is irreplaceable, but we're so excited to bring Chris Thomas on board," said CC President Bob Mohrbacher, Ed. D. "Chris is deeply connected to Centralia College through his work with Centralia High School and the Centralia School Board, and he has important connections with the healthcare sector, which is an important field for many of our students. He's engaged in the community and brings a great perspective and energy to the Centralia College board."

Since 2006, Thomas has been the senior communications manager for Providence South Puget Sound, which includes Providence Centralia Hospital, Providence St. Peter Hospital, and the clinics of Providence Medical Group Southwest Washington. Prior to that, he worked 14 years as a journalist, copy desk chief, and editor at The Chronicle in Centralia. He has a bachelor's degree in communications from Seattle University.

He currently serves on a number of local community organizations. He is an executive board member for the Centralia-Chehalis Chamber of Commerce, and a board member for Centralia High School Dollars for Scholars and Riverside Golf Men's Club. He previously served on the Centralia School District board.

"I'm happy to be here," said Thomas. "I've always been interested in the college and I'm happy to serve the college in this way."

Thomas shared that he graduated from Centralia High School and took calculus at the college in the days before Running Start. He also did on-air play-by-play during some early television broadcasts of Blazer basketball games and wrote articles for the Blue & Gold, Centralia College's former student newspaper.
