

4.155 STUDENT IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

POLICY:

We assign you a student identification number (SID) that is not your social security. We use this SID number as the primary identifier of your college records.

The disclosure of your social security number (SSN) for admission, registration, and records is voluntary. However, we require your social security number (SSN), if you wish to receive financial aid, student employment or tuition tax credit. We request your social security number to help us identify your college records as belonging uniquely to you. We use your SSN internally in our records system only as allowed by law (SB 5509) such as financial aid, transcripts, and workforce tracking. We do not print your SSN on mailing labels, student ID cards, class rosters, and grade mailers. You do not use it to access student web services. Your social security number is not released outside the community college system without your consent or as allowed by FERPA.
