

Centralia College 150% Graduation Rate by Race/Ethnicity

The IPEDS graduation rate tracks students who begin their studies at the college as first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students fall quarter in a given academic year to see how many either completed within six years (150% of normal time to completion). Not all students are included the calculation of the graduation rate. For example, students who enrolled part-time or did not enroll as a degree or certificate-seeking student are excluded.

- Students who begin their studies at Green River in summer or fall quarter of any given year.
- Students who are first-time college students.
- Students who enroll full-time.
- Students who declare their intent is to pursue a degree or certificate.

IPEDS Graduation Rate excludes:

- Students who begin their studies at Green River in winter or spring quarter of any given year.
- Students who transfer-in to Green River from other institutions.
- Students who enroll part-time (taking less than 12 credits per quarter).
- Students who are undecided or do not identify a program of study their first quarter.
